Notes

1. Probably Sexton, a surname found in the village of Tangley in the late 19th century.
2. Not very legible: Reeley or Recley?
3. Harry Box Smith - Box possibly natural father's name.
4. This surname, partly illegible under an ink blot, is Simms, partly confirmed by looking at birth registrations in the Shipston district (included Stourton). Only two Eleanors were registered around the time of the 6-month old baby's birth; only one, an Eleanor Simms, had a surname beginning with S. Her twin brothers Ernest and Herbert Simms were both registered on page 735 of volume 6d, in the register for July, August and September 1898. Other registrations coincide with the names and ages of the other children. As for their father, a John Simms, aged 6, born Brailes, was recorded there at Grove End Farm in the 1851 census.
5. A tramp, aged "45" (probably estimated), "found in Sturch's Barn by Police."

Population: Males 73, Females 74, Total 147.

All the Parish of Sutton-under-Brailes beginning at New Barn Farm and continuing to Green Hill Cottage, Chinslade Farm, The Mill and the Village.

Sutton schedules: 37. Inhabited 37, Uninhabited 2, Tenements of less than 5 rooms, 23.
Population: Males 66, Females 74, Total 140.
